



- Positive postcards will be sent home acknowledging when you have reached the following **Achievement Point thresholds: 50, 100, 150, 200.**
- The top 10 pupils with the highest number of STAR points in each year group will receive a positive text message home.
- The top 5 pupils with the most STAR points in each year group will receive a lunch pass which enables you (and a friend) to skip the lunch queue for a week.
- The pupil with the highest number of STAR points in each year group will be named the **Star of the Week**. Stars of the Week are displayed on the screens around the school.



- Special half termly assemblies will be delivered with certificates and letters home to pupils who display:
- Outstanding Character
- Outstanding Work Ethic
- Outstanding Achievement
- 100% Attendance



- The Star Diploma helps you to become leaders of tomorrow.
- It has three elements:
- Attendance (A)
- Behaviour (B)

- The Star Diploma is a points-based award.
- You will accrue points across each of the three elements over the course of an academic year.

The Binary System

The Binary System - Disruptive and Red Line Behaviours

Our non-negotiables:

If you display a **disruptive** behaviour, you will be given **one warning** to rectify your behaviour. If you fail a second time, you will be referred to the Impact Centre.

If you display a **red line** behaviour, you will be immediately referred to the Impact Centre.

Red line behaviours with an * are likely to lead to an immediate fixed-term exclusion and escalated to a permanent exclusion.



Behaviour: The Binary System – Ready to Learn









Disruptive Behaviours - 1 warning, followed by referral to the Impact Centre

- Inadequate equipment for each lesson
 (Book, Pen, pencil, ruler, calculator, PE kit)
- Arriving 4 or more minutes late to lesson (without a note from a member of staff)
- Littering in the classroom or around the school
- Calling out
- Lack of effort in the classroom
- Lack of pride in work
- Talking over the teacher
- Chewing / eating in class

- Head on desk/ slumped on chair
- Walking off from a member of staff
- Refusing to follow instructions from staff
- Failure to speak to staff with respect
- Failure to speak to peers with respect
- Answering back
- Failure to behave sensibly around the school (such as pushing or horseplay)
- Failure to speak with visitors/supply staff with respect



Behaviour: The Binary System – Ready to Learn









Immediate referral to Impact Centre leading to a possible FTE Behaviours* may lead to an immediate FTE

- Failure to attend a detention
- Failure to comply with the uniform code
- Using headphones/ Bluetooth headsets
- Having a mobile phone in school
- Rude language or swearing
- Name calling
- Cheating in exams/assessments
- Truancy from lessons
- Damaging equipment/property*
- Fighting, physically aggressive or threatening violence*

- Bringing a weapon into school*
- Having alcohol, cigarettes/e-cigarettes or other banned substances in school *
- Assault or inciting violence*
- Theft or bringing in stolen items*
- Cyber bullying*
- Homophobic/racist language*
- Graffiti*
- Dangerous/ unsafe behaviours*
- Extortion*
